Challenges While Waiting for Equipment

As I write this during the second week of December, it seems like winter has already been here for a long time, with multiple below zero mornings already. It also seems to snow most days. The early/harsh winter aggravates the Highway Department's ability to keep our roads reasonably safe.

Highway challenges have been more than normal. There is a national shortage of CDL drivers, made more acute in recent years by the State and Federal mandates regarding how drivers can be trained. Our aging equipment fleet and looming electrical snowplow mandates led our Town Board to decide to purchase two new diesel-powered plow trucks early in 2024. In previous times, those trucks would have been delivered in less than a year. It turns out everyone is trying to buy trucks ahead of the electric mandate. This leads to a backlog at the factories installing the plows and sanders. Our two new trucks have been at the equipment factory since January 2025. Keeping our older units running, along with CDL driver shortage, has made for trying times at the Highway Department.

Tax Season

With the New Year upon us, many of you will be receiving **Property Tax bills**. For the **fourth year in a row**, taxes levied by our Town Board will be **less than in 2022**. The only increase over the last year will be for **lighting districts**. I'm sure most everyone has seen their electric bills rise significantly. As the light districts must be self-sufficient, we must try to keep them adequately funded.

We Thank You for Your Service

We are in the **final stages of remodeling the Town Hall**. As the building will **soon be 50 years old**, it was time to make some updates. As we move into a new year, there will be some changes on our Town Board. **James "Beaver" Bassett** and **Josh Eggleston** will join the Board. New blood helps bring fresh ideas and perspectives to our process. Terms for **Michele Petrashune** and **James "Blue" Terry** are up. Both were heavily involved and I wish to **thank them for their service**.

Town of Saranac Activities Need Your Help

Looking back on 2025, the weather greatly impacted our **September 2025 Field Day**. We were able to have a good turnout for the **parade** and **fireworks**, but the **activities** at the Town Hall were greatly compromised by the rain. **Getting enough volunteers** to put on the events has also been **challenging**. NEWS FROM SARANAC TOWN ASSESSOR CUTTER

Hello Everyone. This is a note from the **new Town** of Saranac Assessor, Glen Cutter.

Exemption Season

I would like to remind everyone we are now in "Exemption Application and Renewal Season", with all forms being due by March 1, 2026. Renewal applications for exemptions that require it were sent out in early November. If you did not receive one, please contact me.

STAR and Enhanced STAR

This year, School Tax Assessment Relief, better known as STAR and ENHANCED STAR exemptions, are being handled directly by New York State. If you already receive either STAR exemptions, you do not have to reapply. NYS may be contacting you directly to request proof of income eligibility.

Eligibility

If you have recently purchased or built a home in Saranac and want to find out if you are eligible to receive either the STAR or ENHANCED STAR exemption, you can either:

Go online to the NYS website at www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/ eligibility.htm

or

Call the Albany Office at 518-457-2036 (weekdays between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm).

Other Available Exemptions

In addition to the STAR program, there are several other exemptions available. The best way to review these exemptions is to look at the Clinton County Real Property website's Exemption page, found at www.clintoncountyny.gov/realproperty/exemptions. This page gives several links to more information for each exemption available.

SARANAC AMERICAN LEGION POST 1618

Winter showed up early this year, but we don't let a little cold weather deter Legionnaires, Sons of the American Legion, Legion Riders, and Legion Auxiliary of Post 1618 from meeting the needs of our community, paying respect to the service of our military brothers and sisters, and setting an example for new generation of American patriots. Here are a few highlights of our many activities.

VETERANS:

Post 1618 continued to support the **North Country Honor Flight** in 2025. The final Honor Flight for this year was held on October 4, 2025. More than 100 motorcycles from the Legion Riders and other groups escorted the attendees to the event, and more than 60 motorcycles escorted them back home at the conclusion of the day. Legionnaires, the Legion Riders, and the **Keysor** and **Laware** families **donated \$12,000** to cover the cost of one flight, including all the veterans on the flight and their guardians. Additional donations were collected for next year's events, scheduled to begin in May 2026. The "Wreaths Across America" program is growing nationwide every year. December 13, 2025, volunteers and supporters gathered to "Remember, Honor and Teach" at more than 5,200 participating locations in all 50 states, at sea and abroad. The 2025 theme is "Keep Moving Forward". We were honored to recognize our deceased fellow Veterans in the Redford and Dannemora cemeteries by placing 480 wreaths at their gravesides. We then held a ceremony at the Legion building on Wilson Rd., placing a wreath for each branch of military service during an Honor Guard rifle salute at our memorial site. A fellowship luncheon, open to the public, followed the event.

In keeping with our mission of service, the Legion continues to assist fellow Veterans in need in several ways. Post 1618 recently contributed to a dinner held by the Mountain Riders, who were raising funds for a member suffering from a stroke. The Legion family also contributed to one of the Sons of the American Legion, whose family member needed eye surgery which was not covered by insurance. Legion members have also made donations of time and funds to the Vets feeding Vets program, the Folds of Honor, the Albany Veterans Housing Services, and the Homeward Bound of the Adirondacks.

COMMUNITY:

The Legion Auxiliary held their **Children's Halloween Party** October 25, 2025 for **70 children and families**. The **Auxiliary** also held their annual **Christmas Breakfast with Santa** December 14, 2024. Gifts were then handed out to local children by Santa. It was another fun time for the kids and the community.

This fall, the Legion continued to sponsor the Lady Mariners softball program by hosting and donating to several spaghetti fundraiser dinners. The Terry Mountain Boys continued to entertain members of the community this summer and fall. They played every other Tuesday from 5:30-7:30pm, and will begin again after the holidays. Keep an eye on the message board on Route 3 for details. The Post 1618 Honor Guard marched in the 2025 Saranac Field Day parade September 6, 2025. The parade concluded at the Town Green, where a dedication ceremony was held for the newly installed memorial clock. This clock and accompanying commemorative plaque, were donated by the American Legion family to honor all the veterans from the Town of Saranac who have served and sacrificed for our Nation

You may have heard of the St. Joseph's Outreach Center on the Military Turnpike Extension in Plattsburgh. They have been raising funds to help pay for a new delivery vehicle, and related equipment. In this edition of our **Hero Highlight**, we honor the service of our Sergeant at Arms, Raymond A. "Ray" LeDuc. Ray was born in 1944 on a farm in Ouebec, near the US border in Chateaugay, the oldest of 8 children. His family moved to the Saranac Valley when he was 9 years old. Ray attended school in Saranac until he was 17. He worked in the logging industry until enlisting in the US Army at the age of 18. He was stationed at Fort Campbell, KY, distinguishing himself as a paratrooper, and completing 24 high risk jumps. After his enlistment, Ray returned to Saranac and married his wife, Barbara "Bobbie" Lamkins, in 1968. They were blessed with 2 sons: Ray. Jr. and Scott, and their daughter, Jeanine. Ray worked in the trucking and logging trades, and later retired from the NYS Department of Corrections as a hospital officer after serving from 1983-2006. Chazy Lake Pump House Chazy Lake, NY

The State Pump House land was purchased in 1931 to supply Clinton Prison clean water from the Chazy Lake Reality Corp.

The water line was dug from Dannemora, over the mountain through the forest, fields and along the road to Chazy Lake.

Many found employment during this difficult period of time.

In May 1942 repairs and line improvement were made. Use of this facility was discontinued around 1983.

This stone structure was site of "The Chazy Lake Museum".

The collection of Wilfred King was displayed in this pump station was a "must see" for all.

Also at this sire there was "The Town Beach" with a "Beach House" michigans were sold by Hazel and Laura King.
